Introduction:

In recent years, cross-border e-commerce has become increasingly common and has caused animal and plant quarantine problems. This workshop will introduce Taiwan's import and export standards and regulations; experience of becoming a disease-free zone for major international animal and plant diseases; and achievements in border quarantine for African swine fever, aphthous fever, citrus greening disease, and assist partner countries in establishing a quarantine system to enhance the international competitiveness of agricultural products.

Objectives:

- Introduce international quarantine standards to strengthen agricultural products and meet the quarantine standards of exporting countries.
- Introduce Taiwan's experience in plant quarantine to help partner countries build animal and plant quarantine mechanisms.

Contents:

- National animal and plant quarantine mechanism and strategy: Introduce Taiwan's practice of
 establishing an animal and plant epidemic prevention system, such as the animal and plant epidemic
 monitoring and notification system.
- Import and export declaration system and regulations of animal and plant quarantine: Share Taiwan's border management, animal and plant prevention and quarantine laws and regulations for imports, and experience in the prevention of African swine fever, aphthous fever, and citrus greening disease.
- Production and verification management: Introduce the Global Good Agriculture Practices (Global G.A.P.) standards and Taiwan's Agricultural Product Production and Verification Management Law.

Issues this workshop will address:

- How to improve the international competitiveness of agriculture.
- How to establish a complete animal and plant quarantine mechanism.
- How to develop an agricultural product verification system to meet international import standards.

Who may apply:

- Agro-environmental departments or senior officials in charge of border management, industry executives, R&D personnel, members of non-governmental organizations or international organizations.
- Preferable background: Animal and plant quarantine, plant disease quarantine, agricultural information.
- Age and Experience: Applicants under 50 years old and with at least two years of work experience in related fields or responsible for formulating and implementing relevant policies, community care or community development counseling related experience is preferred.
- Education: College degree or above
- Language: Good command of English
